

Response

Thank you for your request for the following information:

“dates and types of communication, whether that is by letter, email, text, voicemail, telephone, attendance notes or social media exchanges, between Philip Graf and Martin Cruddace, whilst Mr Cruddace held his position at the Association of British Bookmakers, during 2015.

We also require this information to be itemised to show how many of these communications were by letter, email, telephone, text or via face-to-face meetings.”

Having completed a check of our records, the only communication we hold a record of is the meeting we referred to in our previous response (your reference for this was GC/009). This meeting was listed in a May summary of meetings attended but actually took place on 28 April 2015 (apologies for any confusion caused).
